

About BC Talks Speech Showcase

The event is a speech showcase that will provide a platform to exhibit spoken expressions of our student body as it relates to topics from 2017-2018 College Read's book, *Spare Parts*, by Joshua Davis.

Objectives

- To provide students with a platform to showcase artistic spoken expressions
- To showcase the public speaking capabilities of our student body
- To offer an opportunity for proficient speakers to gain experience
- To educate students on the fundamentals of public speaking by observing proficient speakers
- To promote College Read's readings

Topics of Speech Performance

The topics of BC Talks Speech Showcase are based on the 2017-2018 College Read's book, *Spare Parts* by Joshua Davis. *Spare Parts* is a story of four Mexican high school students, in a competitive underwater robotics team led by two science teachers, who found confidence in the face of failure, academic achievement in a world of low expectations, and both acceptance and triumph amid widespread poverty, fear, immigrant-bashing, and violence.

Speech performance must focus at least one of the major topics in the book. Major topics in the book are the following:

•	perseverance	assimilation	prejudice
•	legal/illegal immigration	robotics	inequality
•	teamwork	STEM	risk-taking
•	innovation	poverty	mentorship

Type of Speech

The following speech performance is welcomed:

- Narrative Speech: Tell a story related to a major topic
- Informative Speech: Describe or explain a major topic
- **Persuasive Speech:** Change or reinforce the ideas, beliefs, attitudes, or behaviors of audience about a major topic
- **Spoken Word:** Perform poetry, comedy, or monologue related to a major topic

Organizational Pattern of Speech

The speech may follow any organizational pattern:

- Topical
- Chronological
- Spatial
- Problem & Solution
- Cause & Effect
- Refutation
- Monroe's Motivated Sequence

Time Length

The speech should be 5 to 6 minutes.

Mode of Delivery:

The speech should be delivered extemporaneously. Speakers may use note cards.

Speaker's Attire:

Speaker should dress in business casual attire.

Eligibility:

To be eligible to participate in the BC Talks, you must meet the following criteria:

- Must be an enrolled Broward College student (full or part-time) for Fall 2017
- Must read the College Read's book, Spare Parts

- Must submit a speech video (visual/audio) to bctalks@broward.edu by Friday, November 10, 2017 by 12:00pm (noon).
- Must be committed to being physically present during the scheduled event on November 17, 2017, if selected as a speaker

Rules

- I. The speech must fit the speech requirements as stated above.
 - All entries must reflect the original work of the speaker.
 - A speech created and presented for a previous class assignment may be submitted.
 - Contestants are STRONGLY encouraged to review their videos to make sure the speeches conform to public speaking guidelines.
- 2. A video file or link (visual and audio) of the speech should be submitted to bctalks@broward.edu by noon (12pm) on Friday, November 10, 2017.
 - The video submission may be the actual video file or link to video (using a hosting site).
 - No entries will be returned, so please keep a copy of your video file.
 - The 7 speakers will be notified by November 13, 2017.
- 3. The BC Talks Committee will select the speakers to present at BC Talks based on the speech video entries.
- 4. Decisions by the committee members are final.
